# BRIEF HISTORY OF THE CERAMIC GARDEN

In 2018, Middleton Hall Retirement Village transformed the former kitchen block into an art studio and library. A resident interested in pottery taught the subject and provided materials, equipment, and a kiln.

Since then, about 40 people have participated in Middleton Hall Retirement Village's ceramic art courses, creating pieces for personal use and displays. In 2022, after being approached to create a ceramic garden in the grounds, the group designed and produced around 80 pieces of stoneware ceramics - including totem poles, plaques, tiles and sculptures - which now adorn the garden.
